## ORDINANCES

These Ordinances shall come into operation on 5 August, 2019.

### **CHAPTER-I: ADMISSION TO THE UNIVERSITY**

#### **Ordinance I: Qualification for Admission**

In order to be eligible for admission to B.A.LL.B (Hons.) Five Year Integrated Course:-

1. The candidate must have passed 10+2 examination of the Board of School Education, Haryana or its equivalent State/Central Board with minimum 45% marks in the aggregate (40% marks for SC/ST candidates)
2. The candidates appearing in or awaiting results of the qualifying examination held or being held in March/April 2020 may also apply and appear for the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) provisionally, subject to the condition that they shall produce the proof of having passed the qualifying examination with the prescribed percentage of marks at the time of their counseling for admission at DBRANLU.
3. The candidature of:
  - a) those who do not clear the qualifying examination with the requisite marks and or fail to produce result on the date of counseling, or
  - b) those who get compartments/re-appear in any subject in the qualifying examination, shall be cancelled and subsequent securing qualifying marks shall not be considered in any case.

A candidate applying in the any type of reserved category is required to submit category certificate issued by the competent authority.

#### **Ordinance II: Admission Process**

Eligibility conditions for admission to the Under-Graduate and Post-Graduate courses of law shall be at par with those laid down by Consortium of National Law Universities which conducts Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) from time to time. The admission committee shall be notified every year by the Competent Authority.

#### **Ordinance III: Re-admission**

1. The result of student who fail to qualify for promotion to next higher class or are detained for shortage of attendance or are not otherwise promoted as per prescribed criteria in these regulations, shall stand cancelled. Such student shall be required to seek fresh admission in the same class in which he/she failed to qualify for promotion to next higher class, as a regular student with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor. Provided that if any student fails to pass any paper(s) of previous class **after appearing in the Repeat Examination**, but has passed the 75% papers of next higher class and consequently will not be eligible for promotion to further next higher class, in such cases his or her result of previous class or next higher class shall not stand cancelled. Such student may be given a further chance to appear in the left out paper of previous class as a re-appear candidate. *e.g. 'A' a student of 4th year has re-appear in one paper of V semester (3rd year), he fails to clear this paper of 3rd year in*

*Repeat Examination. However, he has cleared 75% papers of 4th year. He will not be promoted to 5th year. But his result of 3rd year and 4th year shall not be cancelled and he will be given further chance to clear the paper of 5th semester (3rd year) as a re-appear candidate.*

2. The student shall pay full fee of that course, except the refundable security deposit.
3. The re-admitted student shall be required to pass all the subject afresh as per the current syllabi of the course for the relevant academic session.

#### **Ordinance IV: Academic Calendar**

The Academic Calendar of the Department shall include the following:

1. There shall be at least 180 teaching days in the Academic Year.
2. Department shall follow 06 day teaching schedule per week.
3. Teaching shall commence on in July/August of every year, for all classes, and not conclude prior to May of the following year.
4. Diwali Break in October-November shall be moveable, in order to minimise loss of teaching days on account of festival related holidays whose dates change from year to year; and shall be notified every year accordingly.

#### **Ordinance V: Fee Structure**

The fee-structure for the B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) shall be as prescribed from time to time. However, the following is the fee structure for the academic year 2020-21:

The total intake for the B.A.LL.B.(Hons.) Five-Year Integrated Course shall be One Hundred and Twenty (120). Division of the seats shall be as under:

**\*WL:** Wards of Land owners whose land has been acquired under Land Acquisition Policy of the Government for Rajiv Gandhi Education City, Sonapat

1. Candidate applying in the any type of reserved category is required to submit category certificate issued by the competent authority.
2. The candidate applying under WL category shall have to produce certificate mentioning that his/her or his/her ancestral land has been acquired under land acquisition policy of Rajiv Gandhi Education City, Rai, Sonapat. The said certificate should be dully verified by concerned Tehsildars.
3. Admission to the category of the 'NRIs' shall be direct on the basis of inter-se merit of the qualifying examination after due verification of equivalence and eligibility conditions and also on the basis of Interview to ascertain proficiency in English Language, overall academic records and suitability. Candidates applying in NRI Category shall not be required to appear in CLAT whereas:

**All 'Non Resident Indian' candidates seeking admission to B.A.LL.B.(Hons.) must apply directly to the Registrar, DBRANLU, Rai, Sonapat in prescribed admission form alongwith requisite fee.**

4. The allocation of the candidates to DBRANLU, Sonapat by the CLAT Authority through the Centralised Admission process shall be provisional subject to verification of **original certificates / testimonials and documents by DBRANLU.**
5. There shall be 06 supernumerary seats for wards of resident of Jammu & Kashmir/Kashmiri Migrants and such candidates shall appear in CLAT. For Kashmiri Migrants domicile certificate has been waived by MHRD F. No. 3-4/2017-NCR dated 15.10.2019. J&K Residents, including Kashmiri Pandits/Kashmiri Hindu families (Non-Migrants) living in Kashmir Valley need domicile certificate issued by competent authorities. The other eligibility conditions shall remain the same as that of the general category. In case any of the seat(s) remain(s) vacant in this category, such vacant seat(s) shall not be converted into the General Category.
6. **Conversion of reserved seats into general category:** In case of non-availability of eligible candidate in reserve category, the vacant seat(s) shall be converted as under: (i)

On non-availability of eligible ST candidate, the seat shall be converted into the SC Category. (ii) On non availability of eligible SC candidate, the seat shall be converted into General Category (iii) On non-availability of eligible EWS Category candidate, the seat shall be converted into the General Category. (iv) On non-availability of NRIs, J&K Resident/KM, the seats shall not be converted and shall lapse. (v) On non-availability of WL category candidate, the seat shall be converted into the UR-HR Category. (vi) In the event of quota reserved for PWD remain unutilized due to non availability for suitable category of handicapped candidates, it shall be offered to the Ex-servicemen and their wards and the dependents of Freedom Fighters as per Haryana Govt. Reservation Policy.
